Online Exams

Many people are busy so as to ensure there are a number of online exams available in 2021. Candidates whose exams were cancelled in 2020 will have priority for these places. For these online EATA exams, candidates will not have to apply but will be informed as soon as possible when there is a place available.

There are now two online exams planned for January (one EATA and one ITAA) and another EATA online exam in February. Additionally, we plan an on-site exam for Hamburg in March, as well as exams in April (Milton Keynes), in May (St. Petersburg), in July (Belgrade) and beyond that. Please check the exam calendar on the EATA website for the exam sites in autumn. We are supporting those exam sites to prepare to run their exams online if necessary.
