Training for the new Local Exam Supervisors



- From 2022 we will require people who take on the role of LES for the first time, to have first been a deputy Local Exam Coordinator in a country different to their own within the last five years. COC would also like to encourage experienced Local Exam Supervisors to be deputy LESs in other countries for the same reason. COC will pay the expenses to support these visits to international exam sites.
- We would like to thank the French national association of Transactional Analysis (IFAT) for having recently sent two members as examiners to Rome to participate in an examination session outside their linguistic group (obligation to be LES).

TSTA Exam Application Process



Important Information:

- All documents for a TSTA application to be examined must be sent directly to our Exam Administrator, by email.
- When you apply by email you can request examination at up to three exam sites.
- You are then placed in a waiting list for those exams. Your position in this waiting list is based on the date when the Exam Administrator has received all your documentation.
- The Supervising Examiner will then inform candidates where they will be examined, but only once the Local Exam Supervisors at the exam sites have calculated how many TSTA examinations they can offer.

A Valid TSTA Contract

Part of the requirements for a TSTA exam application is a copy of the candidate's TSTA Contract with their supervisor (Form 12.6.2). This contract must be valid until at least the date of the examinations that the candidate wishes to attend. Your application documentation will not be completed until this is the case.

No more pre-registration process

In case you didn't read our last Newsflash, we want to remind you again that there is no longer a pre-registration process for TSTA examination. The required process is now the one described above.
